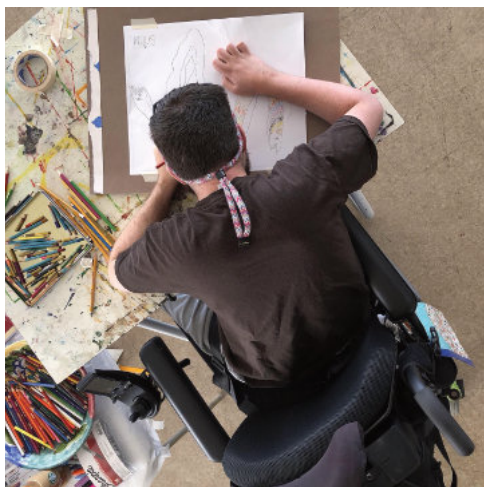

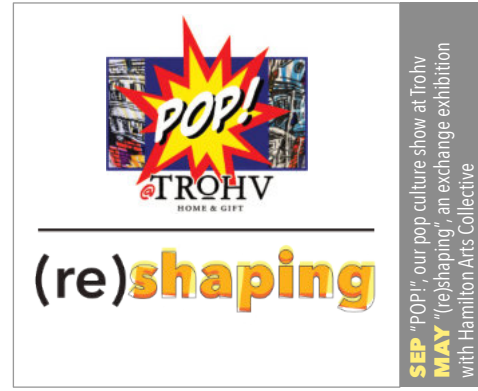

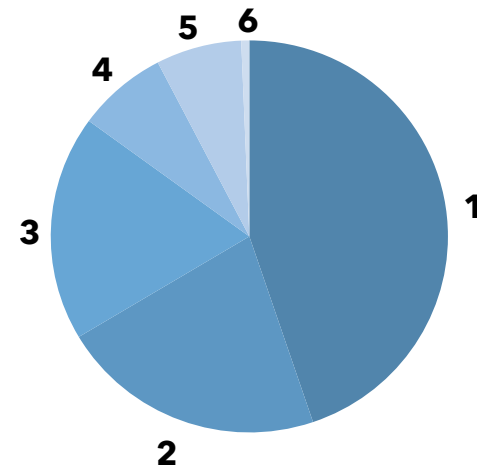
presentations, workshops, and collaborative exhibitions.

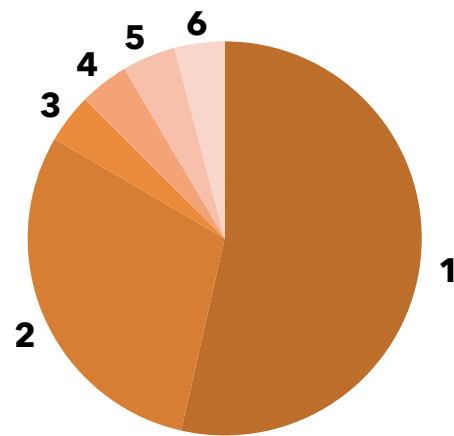

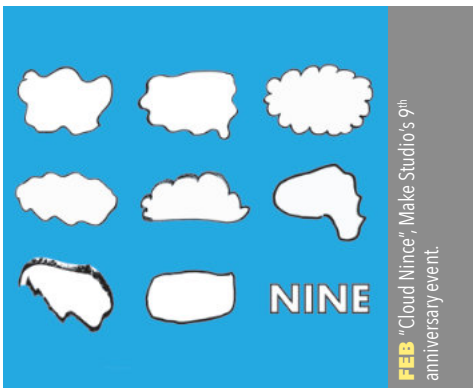

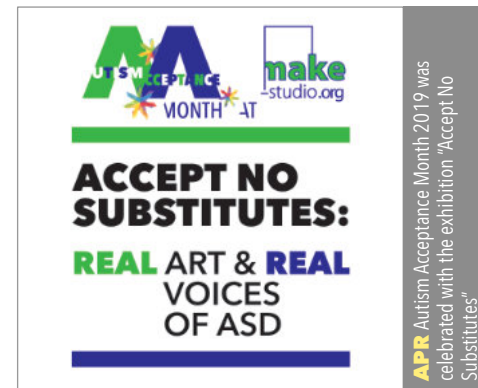
